Dear Parents and Carers,

Welcome back after what we hope was a relaxing and enjoyable Half Term. The children have amazed us so far this year by coping so well with the demands of a full day at school as well as quickly getting used to the lunchtime routine. ©

TOPICS

This half term we have an exciting umbrella topic of 'Let's Celebrate!' This will include looking at changes that occur in Autumn, the Hindu festival of Diwali, World Nursery Rhyme week, Firework Night and Christmas. We will also be focussing stories 'Room on a Broom' and 'The Gruffalo's child' by Julia Donaldson and Axel Scheffler. We are very excited to start practising the songs for our Christmas Nativity 'Miracle in Town' in the next few weeks, more details will follow later this month.

READING AT HOME

We are now reading in a group with the children twice a week and will send these books home that day. After you have read with your child, please write a comment or signature so that we know the book has been read at home. Please keep books and orange reading records in book-bags every day.

MARVELLOUS MAKING

In our 'Creative Area', we like to provide a large variety of resources that the children can choose from to create their models and pictures. We would really appreciate anything you may have at home that might enhance our provision. Examples might include the following: large and small cardboard boxes, kitchen roll tubes, lids, buttons, wool and ribbon, unwanted catalogues and children's magazines. We ask kindly that you don't send in any recycling that has been in contact with dairy such as yogurt pots, chocolate boxes or milk cartons, due to dairy allergies in Reception. FOREST SCHOOL

We have a weekly Forest School session on Wednesday afternoons and will go outside in ALL weathers, excluding high winds. As it is getting much colder, please ensure your child has warm clothing to put on including **named** wellie socks, a hat and gloves. Children will also wear their wellies and waterproof clothing that have kindly been supplied by you, and if needed, their coats.



PARENT HELPERS

Now that the children are settled into Reception, our **Parent Rota** has been placed in the window, please sign up if you are able to pop in for a morning or afternoon (or even for the odd hour), your help will be greatly appreciated!

Please could we just remind you that if you do wish to help out regularly, you will need a **Police Check Form (DBS)**, available from the office. These forms need to be completed and returned to the office along with all relevant documentation as soon as possible. When the checks have been completed, you will be able to sign up and come in to help.

SHOW AND TELL

Children are welcome to bring in a **small topic-related** item to show once a week. We will try our best to show items on the day that they bring it in but should we run out of time, please keep it in their book-bag for the following day. We ask that it is small enough to fit in book-bags and if it is breakable or precious, please give to your child's class teacher in a named bag to enable us to keep it safe. Please ensure you child does not bring in toys from home as they are likely to be confused with ours

How to help your child at home:

- Reading a variety of books with your child.
- Retelling familiar stories in their own words or using the pictures in a book. Can they change the ending?
- Practising oral blending in games such as 'I Spy' (I spy a.. c-a-t/z-i-p).
- Hiding phonemes/words/alphabet/numbers around the house.
- Counting to 20 forwards and backwards and finding one more or one less to 10.
- Singing number rhymes such as Five Currant Buns, Five Little Men in a Flying Saucer, Ten Green Bottles.
- Tracing their name/letters/numbers in a variety of materials e.g. bubbles, sugar, mud, shaving foam, cornflour and water.
- Cutting and sticking pictures from magazines and newspapers to make their own picture.

Physical Development


Moving and Handling

Expressive Arts and Design

Singing Nursery rhymes for World Nursery Rhyme week.

Being Imaginative:

Using material to make traditional Indian dress. Acting out our focus stories.
